COVID-19 Virus Update

As of Sunday, June 14th, Tennessee has had 30,432 cases of COVID-19, with 19,896 recoveries and 475 deaths. McMinn County reports 165 cases with 126 recoveries and 14 deaths. Rhea County shows 232 cases, most of these related to an outbreak from migrant workers at a farm. There have been 210 recoveries. Meigs County reports 29 cases, with 24 recoveries. Monroe County's total is 86 with 74 recoveries and 4 deaths. Bradley County has 281 cases, 195 recoveries, and 2 deaths. Polk County reports 29 cases with 24 recoveries.

- **1520 -** Pope Leo X told Martin Luther, a German monk, that he would be excommunicated from the Catholic Church unless he recanted 41 sentences from his controversial writings. Luther never backed down and was officially excommunicated from the Catholic Church on June 3, 1521 because he denied the supremacy of the pope and declared that church officials could make mistakes. He had also criticized the Catholic Church's practice of selling indulgences as a means of pardoning sinners from part of the penalty for their sins.
- **1775 -** George Washington was appointed commander-in -chief of the Continental Army.
- **1910 -** Orchestra leader David Rose was born. His biggest hit records were "Holiday for Strings" and "The Stripper".
- **1937 -** Country singer Waylon Jennings was born. His biggest records were "Luckenbach", "Texas" and "Mamas Don't Let Your Babies Grow Up To Be Cowboys". **1969 -** "Hee Haw" premiered on CBS-TV starring Roy Clark, Buck Owens, Grandpa Jones, and many others.
