COVID-19 Virus Update

The number of COVID-19 cases in Tennessee keeps going up. Today's total stands at 35,553, an increase of 451, with 23,567 patients recovered and 531 deaths. McMinn County's total is 175 (up 2) with 141 recovered and 15 deaths. Rhea County has had 255 cases, with 228 patients recovered. Meigs County has 31 cases with 25 recovered. Polk County's total is 36 cases with 27 recovered. Monroe County has 109 cases, 83 recoveries, and 4 deaths. Bradley County has had 349 cases, 249 recoveries, and 3 deaths.

TODAY IN HISTORY - JUNE 23rd

1812 - Britain, unaware that America had declared war against it five days earlier, rescinded its policy on neutral shipping, a major issue of contention between the two countries.

1845 - The congress of the Republic of Texas agreed to be an-

1868 - Christopher L. Sholes of Wisconsin patented his typewriter. A Mr. Remington later turned it into a more practical typewriter. Shole's version was a little cumbersome. It was about as big as a desk. And it didn't have any correcting ribbon. The writer didn't need any since the paper was hidden inside the huge typewriter so you couldn't see any typos until after the fact. **1929** - Country singer June Carter Cash was born. She later

became the wife of singer Johnny Cash. She died in 2003.

1931 - A young couple, who unknowingly would become the royal family of the National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing, married today. Anne Bledsoe and William 'Bill' Henry Getty France tied the knot. Together, they built NASCAR into the largest sanctioning organization of auto racing in the world.

1972 - President Nixon signed into law Title IX, which barred discrimination on the basis of sex for "any education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance."

1973 - Watergate special prosecutor Archibald Cox subpoenaed President Richard Nixon to obtain tape recordings of White House conversations about the Watergate break-in.
