It is currently unknown whether the presence of these antibodies will protect your body from contracting COVID-19 again or how long the antibodies remain in the blood. McMinn County's total is 212 with 152 recovered and 17 deaths. Rhea County has had 266 cases, with 239 patients recovered. Meigs County has 32 cases with 27 recovered. Polk County's total is 41 cases with 30 recovered. Monroe County has 118 cases, 90 recoveries, and 4 deaths. Bradley County has had 493 cases, 319 recoveries, and 3 deaths.

TODAY IN HISTORY - JUNE 30th

1859 - French acrobat Blondin crossed Niagara Falls on a tightrope as 5,000 spectators watched.

1917 - Singer Lena Horne was born. Her biggest hit record was "Stormy Weather." Lena Horne died May 9th, 2010.

1921 - Documents were signed forming the Radio Corporation of America, better known as RCA. RCA soon rivaled its main competitor, General Electric (GE).

1934 - Adolf Hitler began his "blood purge" of political and military leaders in Germany in what came to be known as "The Night of the Long Knives.

1936 - The Pulitzer Prize-winning novel "Gone With The Wind" was published. The book by Margaret Mitchell was made into the longest film of its day—220 minutes. The story is set in Atlanta in the Civil War days and has remained popular throughout the years. The movie starred Clark Gable as Rhett Butler, Vivian Leigh, and Olivia de Haviland, among others, including Butterfly McQueen.

1953 - The first Corvette rolled off the Chevrolet assembly line in

Flint, MI. That early 'Vette sold for \$3,250.

1962 - Los Angeles Dodger's star Sandy Koufax pitched his first nohitter in a game with the New York Mets. Koufax would toss three more no-hit games before retiring in 1966.

1971 - The 26th Amendment to the Constitution, lowering the minimum voting age to 18, was ratified as Ohio became the 38th state to

approve it. 2001 - Doctors implanted a dual-purpose pacemaker in Vice Presi-

dent Dick Cheney's chest.
