# The Virus Cases Keep Climbing

As of Sunday, Tennessee has had 51,431 cases of COVID-19, up 1,291 from Saturday. 30,254 patients have recovered and 646 (an increase of 9) have died. McMinn County reports 237 cases, up 5 from Saturday, with 18 deaths. There are 53 active cases in McMinn. Meigs County reports 32 cases, with 27 recoveries. Monroe County's total is 140 with 95 recoveries and 6 deaths. Bradley County has 707 cases, 370 recoveries, and 3 deaths. Polk County reports 45 cases with 32 recoveries.

### Man Faces 2nd Murder Charge

An Athens man has been indicted by the McMinn County Grand Jury on 2nd Degree Murder charges. Kagan Witt, 28, is charged

in the shooting death of Casey Daugherty who died from a single gunshot wound at a residence on County Road 609 in April of 2019. Sheriff Joe Guy says the initial report was an accidental shooting. But Sheriff Guy says Detective Greg Earps continued to look into the case. After a year's worth of investigation and obtaining forensic evidence, a case against Witt was presented to the June session



of the Grand Jury, which issued the indictment. Witt turned himself in at the McMinn County Justice Center last Wednesday. He was released after posting a \$250,000 bond.
