- ✓ The Christian music festival, J-fest, has been cancelled for this year. J-fest was originally scheduled for this past spring, but was moved to August 1st. Now, organizers say they have decided to cancel this year's J-fest in the best interest of the community at large.
- The Gaither 2020 Family Fest in the Smokies has been cancelled. The annual weekend event is normally held over the Memorial Day weekend each year. This year it was postponed to Labor Day weekend. Officers Shoot Armed Suspect

McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy says a wanted suspect is dead after a shooting involving two drug task force officers near Etowah Tuesday evening. The TBI is now investigating the incident. According to a statement from Sheriff Guy, the two officers were serving a felony arrest warrant on Paul Armstrong, 62, at a residence on County Road 909. Preliminary information indicates that around 7 p.m. Tuesday, agents with the 10th Judicial Drug Task Force arrived at the residence to follow up on a narcotics investigation. When officers got to that location, Armstrong came out of the home, holding a gun and pointing it at the officers. At some point during the encounter, the two Task Force Agents, one from the Athens Police Department and one from the McMinn County Sheriff's Office, fired their weapons, striking Armstrong. Armstrong was pronounced dead at the scene. No officers were injured.

UNEMPLOYMENT DROPS IN TENNESSEE

Record high unemployment rates in April experienced sizable decreases in May as the state slowly reopened. McMinn County's jobless rate was 11.7% in May, down from 17.2% in April. Meigs County's rate was 11.8% in May, down from 18.4% in April. Monroe County's unemployment rate in May was 12.8%, down from 21.8% in April. Polk County's jobless rate in May was 9.8%, down from 13.6% in April. In Bradley County, the unemployment rate in May was 9.5%, down from 13.6% in April.


Tennessee's Virus Cases Jump 2,472

Tennessee has recorded its highest one-day increase in COVID-19 cases, a jump of 2,472 in the past 24 hours. The total number of cases now stands at 55,936. There have been 685 deaths, up 20 from Tuesday. McMinn County's total number of cases has gone up 12 and now stands at 255. There are currently 66 active cases in the county. The fatality total remains at 18. Bradley County's total jumped by 101 cases in the last 24 hours, and now stands at 874. There have been four deaths. Monroe County has 141 cases of the virus to date, with six deaths. Meigs County reports 34 cases and 27 recoveries. Polk County has 48 cases and 34 recoveries.
