#### **COVID-19 UPDATE**

The number of confirmed cases of the coronavirus in Tennessee has increased by another 1,605 and now stands at 57,591. There have been 710 deaths, an increase of 25. McMinn County's total number of cases has increased to 257, up 2 from Wednesday. Of those, 174 patients have recovered and 18 have died. There are currently 65 active cases in McMinn County. Monroe County has 146 cases with 105 recoveries and 6 deaths. Bradley County's total at this point is 889, with 464 recoveries and 4 deaths. In Polk County there have been 51 cases of the virus and 35 patients have recovered. Meigs County reports 35 cases with 27 recoveries. Rhea County's total is 294, with 249 recovered.


#### **TODAY IN HISTORY - JULY 10th**

100 B.C. - Julius Caesar was born in Rome.

- **1543** England's King Henry VIII married his sixth and last wife, Catherine Parr.
