Virus in TN is "Uncontrolled"

Public health experts report that Tennessee is one of 18 states that are showing rates of "uncontrolled spread" of COVID-19. The latest count shows Tennessee has had 66,788 cases of the virus. an increase of 1.514 in a 24 hour period. There have been 767 deaths in the state, up 18. McMinn County's total number of cases now stands at 307, up 14 over the past 24 hours. Currently, there are 99 active cases of the virus in McMinn Co. There have been 19 deaths in the county. Bradley County's total has reached 1,061, with 5 deaths. Monroe County is reporting a total of 156 cases with 6 deaths. Meigs County's total to date is 40 cases. 28 of those patients have now recovered. Polk County's total is 57, with 40 patients recovered.

1606 - The Dutch painter Rembrandt was born. His best-known painting is called "The Night Watch.

1779 - Clement Moore was born in New York City. He wrote the popular Christmas poem, "A Visit from Saint Nicholas," also known as "T'was the Night Before Christmas."

1799 - French soldiers in Egypt discovered the Rosetta Stone, which proved instrumental in deciphering ancient Egyptian hieroglyphs.

1912 - The U.S. team led by Jim Thorpe won more medals than any other nation at the Olympic Games in Stockholm, Sweden.

1913 - Country singer Cowboy Copas was born. His hit records include "Alabam" and "Sunny Tennessee." He died in the plane crash that also claimed the life of Patsy Cline.

1946 - Singer Linda Ronstadt was born in Tucson, Arizona. Her hits include "Somewhere Out There," "Blue Bayou," and "Different Drum."
