✓ The McMinn County Board of Education will have a called meeting on Thursday, July 23rd, at 5:30 p.m. One topic on the agenda deals with proposed changes to the 2020-2021 school calendar. The Board will resume meeting as a governing body but will continue to provide electronic meeting access to the public on the school's website and on McMinn County Schools social media sites.

Schools Ready to Open Soon

The McMinn County schools will be opening in early August with a combination of in school and "virtual" classes. School Director Lee Parkison says out of a student body of 5200 students, 800 to 900 will be attending online virtual classes. That's about 17% of the student body. Parkison says each of them will have his or her own computer. And to accommodate families without internet service, flash drives containing the lesson material will be made available to them. For students attending classes at the schools, Parkison says face masks are recommended, but not required, for teachers or students. However, he says desks will be spaced at least six feet apart. As for the fall football season, Parkison says the TSSAA may issue a decision today (Wednesday). He says it would not surprise him to see the start of the football season delayed by a month or

Bradley Co: 1,271 cases to date, 461 are active, and 8 deaths.

Meigs County: 60 cases to date. 29 are still active. **Monroe County:** 213 cases. 72 are active. Death toll is 7. **Polk County:** 75 cases to date, with 28 still active.

A tree fell across County Road 659 Tuesday morning, taking


down three spans of electrical line and causing a broken pole. AUB crews responded to remove the tree, make repairs, and get the power back on. (Photo courtesy of AUB)
