TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. equities were up. Basic materials stocks led the broader market. Utilities stocks lagged. Walmart announced the launch of its new "Walmart+" membership program which will cost \$98 per year and will include gas discounts, free grocery delivery on orders of \$35, and other benefits.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 216 points or 0.8% to 28,646. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 26 points or 0.8% to 3,527, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 164 points or 1.4% to 11,940.

The spot price of gold fell \$2.30 to \$1,976.30, and the price of crude oil rose \$0.30 to \$42.91.

TBI Has New Crime-fighting Tool

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation has a new tool in the fight against crime across the state. His name is Zeus, a 2-year-old yellow Labrador Retriever with a special talent. He can sniff out electronic storage devices--like hard drives, flash drives, even micro SD cards less than a millimeter thick--that could hold vital

evidence, especially in child exploitation cases. Electronic Storage Detection (ESD) K-9s can be vital to investigations as electronic storage devices can easily be overlooked by human eyes, especially when hidden in wall cracks, clothing or ceiling tiles, or tossed into boxes, dirty laundry or the garbage. These devices are less likely to elude detection by Zeus, whose nose is trained to detect a chemical compound used on practically all of these devices. When not utilizing his ESD capabilities, Zeus will serve as a comfort companion to



both law enforcement officers and the public, such as child victims. He will also assist in stress diffusion and show off his skills to school and civic groups.



TODAY IN HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 2ND

1666 - The Great London Fire started. Only six people died, but 13,200 houses burned down and 80,000 people were left homeless. The fire started in a wooden house on Pudding Lane near the Tower of London. It was this fire that prompted the first fire insurance policy.

1789 - The U.S. Treasury Department was established.

1864 - Union Gen. William \overline{T} . Sherman's forces occupied Atlanta during the Civil War.

1901 - Vice President Theodore Roosevelt offered the advice, "Speak softly and carry a big stick," in a speech at the Minnesota State Fair.

1935 - A hurricane slammed into the Florida Keys, claiming 423 lives.

1938 - Singer Jimmy Clanton was born. His hit records include "Just A Dream" and "Venus In Blue Jeans."

1944 - Navy pilot George H.W. Bush was shot down by Japanese forces as he completed a bombing run over the Bonin Islands.

1945 - Japan signed an unconditional surrender aboard the U.S. Battle-ship "Missouri" in Tokyo Bay, ending World War II.

1968 - World War One hero, Army Sergeant Alvin York, died at the age of 76. He was from Pall Mall, Tennessee. He led an attack on a German machine gun nest and captured 132 prisoners and 35 machine guns almost singlehandedly. When he was asked how he did that all by himself, he replied: "I surrounded 'em".
