Mask Mandate for McMinn Schools

When students return to the McMinn County Schools the day after Labor Day, September 8th, they will be required to wear face masks. Director of Schools Lee Parkison has issued a mask mandate for all school employees. Masks will be required for all common areas and within six feet of another person. There is also a mask mandate for all high school students. Parkison says all students grades 4-12 must wear masks when riding a bus. He says any student who needs a mask can see his or her teacher or principal.

Senior Center Update

Senior Centers across Tennessee remain closed through at least September 30th according to an executive order from the Governor. That includes the McMinn County Senior Citizens Center in Athens. Executive Director Tina South says although the Center building is closed, they are still serving the needs of seniors by providing meals on wheels delivery along with a wellness check. She says they provide food and supplies to other at-risk seniors who are able to drive to the Center and pick up what they need. Ms. South says they are also calling seniors on a weekly basis to check on them. Seniors in need can call the Senior Center at 745-6830 and leave their name and phone number.

Wednesday's Market Report

U.S. equities were up. Utilities stocks led the broader market. Energy stocks lagged. Macy's reported a \$431 million loss for its most recent fiscal quarter. Interest rates declined.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 455 points or 1.6% to 29,101. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 54 points or 1.5% to 3,581, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 117 points or 1.0% to 12,056.

◆ ENGLEWOOD WATER TOWER PLANS

The Englewood Water Towers Preservation Committee has opened a fund with East Tennessee Foundation which will support the efforts to restore the historic water tower. The tower was built in 1937 using funds provided by the Works Project Administration Program. The 144-foot tower is currently being considered for the National Register and, if successful, will become the first Tennessee Water Tower on the Register. A Town Hall meeting to formally announce the project will be held on November 14th at 6 p.m. at the Englewood Community Building. Representatives from the Committee and East Tennessee Foundation will be present to describe the anticipated project and steps to be accomplished. Contributions will be accepted at the meeting
