Political Sign Guidelines

In addition to the ever present real estate signs, we're seeing more and more political signs in Athens. The Athens Municipal Code spells out the political sign guidelines for the city:

No political sign shall be placed within any public right of way in the corporate limits of Athens.

Political signs shall not be erected or otherwise fixed to any pole, tree, stone, fence, or any object within the right-of-way of any street.

The general rule for placement of political signs is that they should be at least 2 feet behind any utility pole/sidewalk along the street to ensure they are located on private property and do not block vehicle or pedestrian visibility. In addition State Law prohibits affixing any signs directly to any utility pole.

Get owners permission to put signs on private property.


