Loose Leaf Collection routes will begin on Monday, November 2nd, at 7 a.m. If you would like your leaves to be collected, you should rake them three to five feet from the edge of the road as soon as they fall. Do NOT place leaves in the road, in drainage ditches, or on sidewalks.
