PFIZER TO DO PILOT PROGRAM IN TN

Pfizer has chosen Tennessee and three other states for a pilot program on its new COVID-19 immunization. The pilot program will help with planning vaccine delivery and deployment. The other three states are Rhode Island, Texas, and New Mexico. They were chosen for the pilot program because of their differences in size and population. The vaccine must be stored at an ultra-cold temperature of minus 94 degrees Fahrenheit, which presents a distribution challenge. The company says it will take what it learns in the pilot program and adapt it to other states across the country.
