Update on Playoff Game

More details have come to light about the controversy over the McMinn County High School and Dobyns-Bennett High School playoff game. The game was scheduled to be played last Friday night in Kingsport, but just before kickoff it was postponed due to alleged COVID-19 violations on the part of McMinn County. However, the TSSAA obtained more information over the weekend and agreed to let the two teams play on Tuesday if the McMinn County Health Department would provide verification that McMinn High had followed proper procedures for contact tracing involving one player who had been ill at practice. The TSSAA said it had to receive the verification by the end of the day Monday. Monday night, they said they had not gotten the information and had to call off the Tuesday game. All fingers began pointing at the Health Department. Meantime, the State Health Department has issued a statement saying the requested contact tracing information was turned over to the TSSAA Monday evening. The TSSAA says it did not receive it in time, and had no alternative but to call off the game. Amanda Goodhard with the TN Department of Health says the McMinn County Health Department followed the protocols and processes to the letter.
