Changes in COVID-19 Testing

Tennessee Department of Health COVID-19 testing sites across the state will begin offering self-testing kits to adults three days a week beginning December 21st to allow staff members to transition to vaccination of frontline health care providers and first responders Local county health departments will continue to offer COVID-19 testing five days a week at no charge for anyone who wishes to be tested. However, the new COVID-19 self-test kits will be offered to adults on Mondays. Wednesdays, and Fridays. Individuals will remain in their vehicles while completing paperwork and collecting their own nasal samples. Health departments will submit the samples to the lab for testing. Adults tested with the new self-tests will register and receive their results online. The self-tests are not approved for use by children under age 18. Both children and adults can still receive the standard drive-thru nasal swab COVID-19 tests on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Test results should be available within 72 hours of arrival at the lab. County Health Departments will be closed and will not offer COVID testing Dec. 24th-25th and Dec. 31st-Jan 1st.

History of Downtown Nativity

For the past 32 Christmas holidays, motorists driving along Green Street past Veterans Park have been seeing a Nativity Scene. The late Libby Johnson started putting up the display in December of 1990. She said she got tired of seeing a display featuring Santa at what was then called Sunset Park. So, she asked Mrs. Long, who owned the big white house next to the park, if she could set up a Nativity Scene in her front yard. It's been there ever since. Miss Libby told us that one year someone stole the Baby Jesus doll. Another year, somebody complained about a Nativity Scene on city property. The complainer was quickly informed that the display is on private property. Miss Libby said several years ago, Mrs. Long's family members agreed to take over the responsibility for the Nativity Scene.
