

Athens Police/Fire Reports

The Athens City Council heard reports from the police and fire departments about November activity at their monthly meeting Tuesday night.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 68 thefts in Athens in November, 13 motor vehicle thefts, 10 burglaries, 8 assaults, 2 robberies, and 2 sex offenses. Officers issued 153 citations for moving violations. There were 23 drug violations. Officers made 99 arrests in November. There were 71 vehicle accidents, with 18 injuries. Chief Couch's report lists 5 vacancies on the police department.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 137 calls in November. The calls included one building fire, 13 motor vehicle accidents with injuries, and 82 calls for medical assists and assistance to EMS crews. Firefighters also responded to a bomb scare at TWU which turned out to be a hoax. Losses for the month totaled \$20,000.
