Council Approves Tax Hike

The Athens City Council has given final approval to an 8-cent increase in the property tax to pay for a \$7.5 million loan to fund several capital projects including street improvements around the new schools now under construction, a new animal shelter, a fire training facility, and renovations of the Athens Municipal Building and the Public Works building. Related to the property tax, the Council passed a resolution to roll back the 8-cent tax hike once the debt service on the \$7.5 million loan has been satisfied. The Council passed a proclamation designating the week of June 20th-26th as Amateur Radio Week in Athens, Also, at Tuesday's monthly Council meeting, reports of activity for the month of May were given by the police and fire department chiefs.

- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 45 thefts in May, 12 assaults, 10 burglaries, two motor vehicle thefts, one homicide, and one sex offense. Officers issued citations for 189 moving violations. There were 66 traffic accidents in the city in May, with 16 injuries. Chief Couch reported the police force is now fully staffed with no vacancies.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 184 incidents in May. Rescue and emergency medical service accounted for 129 of the calls. There were four fires and 17 false alarms. Losses from fires in May in the city totaled \$125,000.
