Time to Get Your Flu Shot

To minimize the spread of influenza this fall and winter, Starr Regional Medical Center is encouraging all community members to get vaccinated as soon as possible. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control recommends annual flu vaccination for everyone six months and older. Ronald Hall, chief nursing officer at Starr Regional, says the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the potential for increased flu activity over the next several months make it vital that you get vaccinated against both the flu and COVID. This year Starr Regional will offer two opportunities to get vaccinated as well as support the Friendly Fellow Club's annual Christmas baskets program. Flu vaccines will be available Friday. Oct. 22nd, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Athens Market Park Pavilion in conjunction with the 12th annual Think Pink event. The Friendly Fellow Flu Shot fundraiser will be Friday, Oct. 29th, with flu shots from 7 a.m. until noon in the hospital lobby. The vaccine is free, but donations are encouraged..

Due to COVID concerns, a graveside only service will be held at Calhoun Cemetery on Friday, October 15th, at 12 noon. Companion Funeral Home of Athens is in charge.
- James "Jim" Sanford Cook, age 86, of the Goodsprings Community, died Tuesday, Oct. 12th. He worked many years in the enamel business at Athens Stove Works, Madison Industries in Conyers, GA, and Chi-Vit Industries based in Chicago. He later started his own spray foam roofing business called Pro-Tec Unlimited in Tennessee. Graveside services will be at 2 p.m. Friday at Goodsprings Baptist Church Cemetery. No formal visitation will be held. Bordwine Funeral Home is in charge.

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REDORT: Stocks ended higher as investors weighed higher-than-expected inflation and corporate earnings. Utilities and technology sectors led the gains. Financial stocks were the biggest underperformer. Consumer spending is fueling demand for goods and services, and could continue for some time.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 0.53 to 34,377.81. The S&P 500 was up 13.15 to 4,363.80, and the NASDAQ was up 105.71 to 14,571.63.

Slow Down Tennessee

On Friday, October 15th, the Tennessee Highway Safety Office will launch its speeding prevention campaign called "Slow Down Tennessee" in partnership with the Tennessee Highway Patrol, Triple A, and local law enforcement agencies. From October 15th to the 29th, participating agencies will increase public education and enforcement efforts to reduce speeding-related crashes, injuries, and fatalities statewide. This year, the emphasis will be on teen safety. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death of teenagers in America. According to the National Safety Traffic Safety Administration, there were 2,042 traffic fatalities nation-

wide in 2019 involving a teenage driver. In Tennessee, there were 100 traffic fatalities involving a teen driver in 2019. The "Slow Down



Tennessee" campaign includes a multi-pronged approach. The public is encouraged to participate by using #SlowDownTN on social media to help spread awareness. Participating law enforcement agencies statewide will increase saturation patrols, conduct high visibility enforcement, and use other tactics to curb speeding drivers. Outdoor signs will display "Slow Down Tennessee" using large banners, TDOT's digital message boards, and yard signs provided by AAA.
