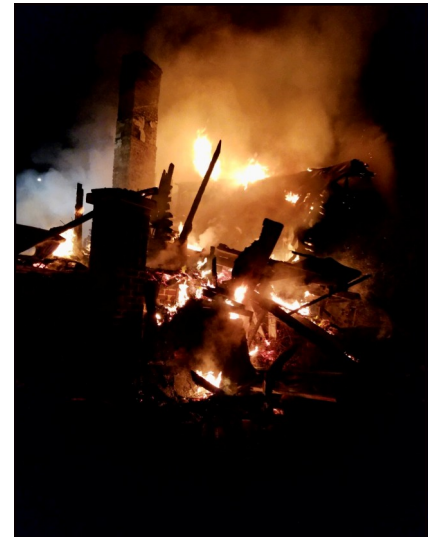

- ✓ The Englewood Rural Fire Department has released incident statistics for the year 2021. There was nearly a 30% increase in call volume. The Englewood Fire Department saved a total of \$1,098,550 of both private and commercial properties. The fire department responded to 639 calls. The calls consisted of 314 fires and 525 EMS calls. The department responded to 85 calls for mutual aid.

Woman Dies In House Fire

A Monday evening house fire in Niota has claimed the life of a woman residing there. Sheriff Joe Guy says a 911 call was received just after 7:30 p.m. about a house fire on County Road 384 just outside of Niota. The Niota Rural, Englewood Rural, and Athens Rural Fire Departments responded. When they arrived, they found the house fully involved in flames. Witnesses at the scene say they believed a female who lived there was still inside. One resident who also lived there was able to get out and was trying unsuccessfully to get the other resident out. Sheriff Guy says the case was turned over to TBI Bomb and Arson Investigators which is commonplace when a fire involves a death. The victim's name has not been released.

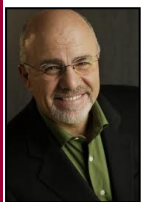

Starr Regional Welcomes New FNP

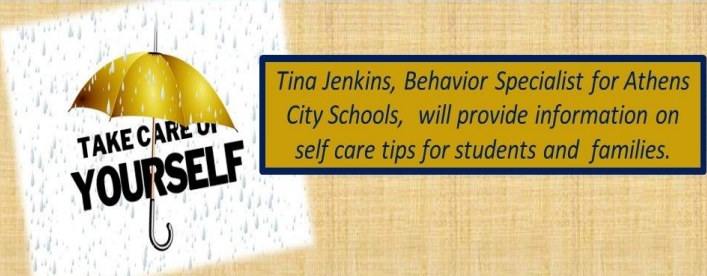

TODAY IN HISTORY - JANUARY 12th

- 1628** - Charles Perrault, author of "Cinderella" and "Sleeping Beauty," was born in Paris. He also wrote "Little Red Riding Hood" and "Tom Thumb." His writings were published in a book titled "Tales of Mother Goose."
- 1905** - Tex Ritter, singer and cowboy movie star, was born. He sang the Academy Award winning song from the 1952 film, "High Noon."
- 1915** - The U.S. House of Representatives rejected, 204-174, a proposed constitutional amendment to give women nationwide the right to vote.
- 1951** - The nation's most popular radio talk show host, Rush Limbaugh, was born
- 1959** - Berry Gordy Jr. founded Motown Records (originally Tamla Records) in Detroit.
- 1991** - A deeply divided Congress gave President George H.W. Bush the authority to use force to expel Iraq from Kuwait. (The Senate vote was 52-47; the House followed suit 250-183.)
- 2000** - In a 5-4 decision, the U.S. Supreme Court, in *Illinois v. Wardlow*, gave police broad authority to stop and question people who run at the sight of an officer.
