Athens, Tennessee

Today In History

1830 - The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints was organized by Joseph Smith in Fayette, New York.

1862 - The Civil War Battle of Shiloh began in Tennessee as Confederate forces launched a surprise attack against Union troops, who beat back the Confederates the next day.

1896 - The first modern Olympic games formally opened in Athens, Greece.

1909 - American explorers Robert E. Peary and Matthew A. Henson and four Inuits became the first men to reach the North Pole.

1917 - The United States entered World War I as the House joined the Senate in approving a declaration of war against Germany that was then signed by President Woodrow Wilson.

1945 - During World War II, the Japanese warship Yamato and nine other vessels sailed on a suicide mission to attack the U.S. fleet off Okinawa; the fleet was intercepted the next day.

1954 - Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy, R-Wis., responding to CBS newsman Edward R. Murrow's broadside against him on "See It Now," said in remarks filmed for the program that Murrow had, in the past, "engaged in propaganda for Communist causes."

1971 - Russian-born composer Igor Stravinsky, 88, died in New York City.

1973 - Ron Blomberg of the New York Yankees became Major League Baseball's first designated hitter as he faced pitcher Luis Tiant of the Boston Red Sox at Fenway Park. (Blomberg was walked with the bases loaded; Boston won the game, 15-5.)

1994 - Supreme Court Justice Harry A. Blackmun announced his retirement after 24 years.

1998 - The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed above 9,000 points for the first time, ending the day at 9,033.23.

1998 - Country singer Tammy Wynette died at her Nashville home at age 55.

Weather/Pollen

WEATHER: It will be mostly cloudy today with a chance of rain & thunderstorms. Highs will be in the upper 70's and lower 80's. Chance of thunderstorms in the evening and possible rain after midnight tonight. Temperature for tonight will be in the lower 50's. Weather at: wyxi.com

POLLEN: The pollen levels will fall into the moderate range which is above 4.0. This relief is caused by falling temperatures, rising humidity, and expected precipitation in the morning, afternoon and evening which tends to wash pollen out of the air.

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT:

Stocks finished lower. Bonds rallied and private payrolls reported by ADP rose less than expected. The unemployment rate is expected to stay around 3.6%, with the economy adding 240,000 jobs. The 10-year treasury yield fell to around 3.30%. The defensive sectors led while tech lagged. Oil prices were little changed at around \$80.

At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 80.34 to 33,482.72. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 10.22 to 4,090.38 and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 129.46 to 11,996.86.
