Tuesday's Market Report

The Dow closed down while the S&P and Nasdaq closed up. Consumer staples and communication services were the best performing sectors of the S&P 500. The 10-year Treasury yield rose to around 4.14% and the 2-year yield ticked lower to 4.38%. Asian markets were mostly higher. At the closing bell, the Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 96.36 to 37,905.45. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 14.17 to 4,864.60, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 65.66 to 15,424.94.
