McCowan Cruiser Memorialized



The decision has been made by the Blount County Commission to retire the vehicle that once belonged to the late Deputy Greg

McCowan from active duty, instead choosing to bestow upon it a dignified memorial. Through the approval of a resolution, a sum of \$70,725 has been earmarked for allocation to the Blount County Sheriff's Office, with the express purpose of acquiring a replacement vehicle. This thoughtful gesture ensures that Deputy McCowan's cruiser will not fade into obscurity but will be tenderly preserved and revered in remembrance of his service and sacrifice. Tragically, Deputy McCowan met his untimely end on February 8 while carrying out his duty during a routine traffic stop. His passing, marked by solemnity and honor, drew the attention of the public, with his funeral service being broadcast on television and attended by Governor Lee and numerous other esteemed dignitaries, who gathered to pay their respects and honor his memory.

Civil Rights Town Hall at TWU

Tennessee Wesleyan University is organizing a community town-hall in Athens on Tuesday, March 26 at 7 p.m. in Townsend Auditorium, focusing on the Civil Rights Movement. Dr. Chris Schutz and Cliff Couch will moderate a panel featuring four McMinn County residents who will share their personal experiences. Panelists include Anne Boyd, Robert McCowan Jr., Ray Johnson, and Dr. Vant Hardaway, each with unique perspectives on civil rights in the area. Anne Boyd is the current president of the local NAACP chapter and the first African American student to attend Etowah City Elementary School. Robert McCowan Jr. is a retired officer and one of the first African American law enforcement officers in Athens. Ray Johnson is a lifelong McMinn County resident and was part of the last graduating class from J.L. Cook School. Dr. Vant Hardaway, a retired educator, was part of the 1967 MCHS graduating class, the first full class after desegregation in the McMinn County school system. The event is free to attend and open to all community members, offering an opportunity for meaningful dialogue and reflection.

Trapped in Maury County

The Maury County Fire Department responded to a mutual aid call due to a landslide incident that trapped a man operating a backhoe in nearby Lewis County. Upon arrival, they found the backhoe completely buried under the collapsed face of a chert pit. Remarkably, the equipment operator had been trapped for approximately 12 hours before being discovered by family members who could not get in contact with him. With only his head and one arm visible under a small portion of the backhoe's roof, a pipe was deployed to provide him with fresh air. Heavy equipment, including a skid steer, excavators, and backhoes from public and private sources, was swiftly mobilized to the scene. The coordinated efforts of skilled operators played a crucial role in the successful outcome of the rescue operation. Incident command and operations were effectively managed by the Hohenwald City and Lewis County FD, with firefighters from multiple departments joining forces to dig out the trapped individual using shovels and forming a "bucket brigade" to remove dirt from the vicinity of the backhoe.
