Lee Addresses A.I. Impact on Music Industry

On Thursday, March 21, Tennessee Governor Bill Lee signed the Ensuring Likeness Voice and Image Security (ELVIS) Act, a groundbreaking legislation aimed at safeguarding the voices of musicians and music industry professionals from the misuse of artificial intelligence (AI). Tennessee's music industry supports more than 61,617 jobs across the state, contributes \$5.8 billion to our GDP, and fills over 4,500 music venues. This act is the first of its kind, making Tennessee the first state in the nation to address the impact of A.I. in the music industry.

"From Beale Street to Broadway, to Bristol and beyond, Tennessee is known for our rich artistic heritage that tells the story of our great state," said Gov. Lee. "As the technology landscape evolves with artificial intelligence, I thank the General Assembly for its partnership in creating legal protection for our best-in-class artists and songwriters."

The law updates Tennessee's Protection of Personal Rights law to include protections for songwriters, performers, and other professionals in the music industry. This move comes in response to the growing threat posed by AI-generated synthetic media, which can lead to unauthorized fake works using the likeness and voice of artists. The ELVIS Act adds "voice" to the existing protections against unauthorized use of someone's likeness. Legislative leaders and industry professionals hailed the law as a crucial step in preserving the humanity and artistic expression of Tennessee's creators, while also maintaining public trust and protecting the livelihoods of those in the music industry. The legislation received broad support from various industry groups, signaling a united effort to combat the challenges posed by AI technology in the realm of creative arts.

Bradley Co. Sheriff in ICU

Bradley County Sheriff Steve Lawson and his wife are currently in recovery following a collision in Hamilton County on Sunday. The incident, reported by the Bradley County Sheriff's Office, occurred approximately at 1:00 pm near the Shallowford Road exit of I-75. Sheriff Lawson is presently in the ICU due to bleeding and severe discomfort. According to the sheriff's office, he had recently left a church service and was driving his personal vehicle at the time of the accident. Chattanooga police indicate that initial investigations suggest three vehicles had come to a stop or were moving slowly due to heavy traffic. However, a fourth vehicle failed to halt, resulting in a rear-end collision with one of the vehicles, subsequently causing a chain reaction involving the others by striking the vehicles ahead.
