Harper Ousted, Lady Vols Fire Head Coach



Tennessee's women's basketball program has decided to part ways with coach Kellie Harper after five seasons, aiming to revitalize the team's performance, which has declined since the era of legendary coach Pat Summitt. Despite her connection to Summitt as a former player, Harper struggled to bring the program back to its former glory, never advancing beyond the Sweet 16 despite winning 20 or more games four times. The deci-

sion comes after Tennessee's recent loss in the NCAA tournament second round, finishing 20-13 for the season. Harper, who had four years remaining on her contract, saw her buyout drop significantly. UT Athletic director Danny White expressed gratitude for Harper's dedication but emphasized the need for change. Tennessee has not won the SEC conference since 2015, with South Carolina emerging as a dominant force in women's college basketball. (Story Continued on page 3)

AUB Rate Increase

The Athens Utilities Board (AUB) has approved a rate increase effective April 1 of 2.9% for the power division starting in the second quarter of 2024. AUB claims this decision comes in response to rising costs for materials to maintain operational efficiency. In a press release last week, AUB emphasized their approach to rate changes, ensuring increases are only made when necessary to sustain utility operations. Despite the increase, April's rates will actually decrease due to lower base rates and fuel costs. This marks the fourth increase in 16 years, totaling a 6.0% increase since 2008. It's important to note that the rate increase only applies to the AUB portion of customers' bills, with TVA controlling seasonal base rates and fuel cost adjustments. TVA expects higher fuel costs due to cold temperatures and increased demand in January. AUB typically allocates 83 cents of every dollar collected to cover their monthly power bill from TVA.

Federal Funds Coming to McMinn Co.

McMinn County has been awarded \$19,729 in Federal Funds through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)'s Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Program, aimed at supplementing local emergency food and shelter programs in Phase 41. The selection was made by a National Board chaired by FEMA, comprising representatives from various organizations. A Local Board in McMinn County will determine how the funds are allocated among local service agencies, ensuring they meet specified criteria. Interested agencies are encouraged to contact the United Way office for application details before the April 22, 2024 deadline. Past recipients of Emergency Food and Shelter funds in McMinn County include Coordinated Charities, Grace and Mercy Ministries, Better Living Center, Love Thy Neighbor Project, Table Graces, and others. Harper, who succeeded Holly Warlick in 2019, acknowledged the honor of coaching at her alma mater but acknowledged the challenges in living up to Summitt's legacy. Despite consistent NCAA tournament appearances, the Lady Vols failed to advance far enough, underscoring the high expectations set by Summitt's historic success. In the seven years under Harper, the Lady Vols never once reached the Final Four and lost in the first or second round in five of their past seven NCAA tournament appearances. As a former player under Summitt, Harper remains a significant figure in Tennessee's basketball history, having contributed to three consecutive national championships between 1996-1998. In fact, in Harper's last season as the starting point guard at Tennessee, the 1998 team went 39-0, Pat Summitt's only undefeated season. Despite speculation, as of now, it is unclear to whom the Lady Vols' Head Coach position will be offered. However, by firing Harper, Tennessee's administration has sent a clear message about what its expectations are.
