

p.m. on Sunday, resulting in the death of one man and injuries to several others. A pregnant woman was hospitalized due to a panic attack. Police clarified that it was not a shootout but rather a single individual who brandished a pistol during an altercation. The gunman, who arrived just minutes before the incident, fled the scene in a Mercedes GLS 450. Authorities stated that there is currently no evidence suggesting that the individuals involved in the altercation were acquainted. Detectives are actively investigating the incident to find the motive and locate the perpetrator.

"Honoring the Fallen" Plates Arrive

The state of Tennessee has introduced "Honoring the Fallen" specialty license plates to commemorate fallen police officers. This initiative was spearheaded by a woman who lost her husband, a police officer, nearly 30 years ago. At the time, the widow had a four-year-old son, with a daughter on the way. She promised that her husband would not be forgotten. After years of advocacy, legislation was passed in 2022 to make these specialty plates available to the public. Fire in Wilson Co., Investigation Underway



Deputies in Wilson County are investigating a trailer fire containing Bibles, which occurred on Easter Sunday around 6 am. The fire, located at the intersection of Old Lebanon Dirt Road and Chandler Road, was extinguished by firefighters. Wilson County Sheriff's Office (WCSO) took over the investigation, stating the trailer had been inten-

According to the WCSO, specific details are being withheld to maintain the integrity of the inquiry. However, deputies ensured citizens that "the safety and security of our residents remains our utmost priority." Pastor Greg Locke of Global Vision Bible Church shared images of the burned trailer on social media, expressing shock at the incident. Despite challenges, Locke emphasized the congregation's resilience and urged moving forward.
