USPS Considering Moving Mail Operations Out of Knoxville

The U.S. Postal Service is considering transferring some mail operations from Knoxville to Nashville, aiming to modernize without "career layoffs". However, concerns persist among employees, fearing potential job losses despite reassurances. Documents from the USPS detailing the possible change suggest that the Knoxville facility is not closing. However, union documents suggest that 71 positions in East Tennessee may be affected. USPS anticipates cost savings of up to \$1.3 million in mail processing costs, and \$1.1 million in maintenance costs. A union leader with USPS workers said workers with less than two years of service are usually the first to be impacted. Representative Tim Burchett stated that he is in talks with the Postmaster General and has shared his concerns about the possible relocation. Workers have stated that the relocation of the processing operations to Nashville could delay mail delivery by about a day.

SB 1325 Passes in Senate, Heads to House



The Tennessee Senate, in a 26 - 5 vote along partisan lines, passed a bill allowing certain teachers and staff to carry concealed handguns in public schools.

Amid protests from gun control advocates, Lt. Gov. Randy McNally ordered state troopers to clear the gallery of the protesters. The bill awaits a vote in the House and lays out the different conditions to guns entering local classrooms.

First, the local district and law enforcement agency would have to agree to pursue the policy. Second, interested teachers and school staff who have an enhanced handgun permit would have to complete 40 hours of certified training in school policing at their own expense, and pass a mental health evaluation and an FBI background check. That training would have to be renewed every year that the teacher was carrying. (Story continued on Page 4)

SB 1325 Passes in Senate, Heads to House

Parents would not be notified if their child's teacher is armed. And one provision of the bill shields districts and law enforcement agencies from potential civil lawsuits over how a teacher or school employee uses, or doesn't use, a handgun under the proposed law. Critics argue it puts children at risk and is contradictory to past laws enacted under parental rights. Proponents say it's necessary for protecting against potential school shooters.


Sen. Paul Bailey, the sponsor of the bill in the Senate, explained that the clause regarding not informing parents is aimed at dissuading potential intruders who wouldn't be aware of which staff members are armed. He clarified that any responsibility for an incident would fall on the teacher opting to carry a firearm under the legislation.
