#### Press Release: McMinn Co. Deputies Catch Burglars at Sweetwater Airsoft

McMinn County deputies responded to a reported theft occurring at a business early Monday morning and caught the burglars in the act.

According to Sheriff Joe Guy, on April 7 around 12:30am, deputies were dispatched to a report of a theft in progress at Sweetwater Airsoft on County Road 275. Dispatchers advised that the business had also experienced a burglary the night before. As deputies arrived, they located a Ford F150 with 2 suspects inside. As more deputies arrived, a search was conducted of the area and 3 more suspects were located at the corner of the property. The suspects were identified as Joshua Weber 18, of Vonore; James Whitner, 20, of Sweetwater; Blake

Fisher, 19, of Athens; and Paiden Davis, 24, of Vonore, along with a 17 year-old male juvenile. Detectives arrived on the scene and an investigation commenced.

"It appeared that Weber and the juvenile had been to the Airsoft business at some time before and had returned the night before with Whitner, Davis and Fisher and burglarized it," said Sheriff Guy. "They returned the next night to do the same. Weber, Whitner and the juvenile broke in while Davis and Fisher waited outside in the truck. Several of the airsoft guns and other accessories had been hidden in the nearby woods and deputies were able to locate those, and others the thieves had taken to the homes of Webber and the juvenile in Monroe County. Those were later recovered from both locations with the assistance of Monroe County

Joshua Weber was charged with 2 counts of Burglary, 2 counts of Theft over \$1000 and was held on a \$56,000 bond. James Whitner was charged with Felony Burglary and Theft over \$2500 and was held on a \$56,000 bond. Paiden Davis was charged with Conspiracy to Commit Burglary and was held on a \$10,000 bond, and Blake Fisher was charged with Conspiracy to Commit Burglary and was held on a \$5000 bond. The juvenile was charged separately through juvenile court. The stolen items were returned to the business owners as they were recovered.



#### Donald Dodgen inducted into TSSAA Hall of Fame Class of 2025



Eight distinguished individuals were honored as the Class of 2025 inductees into the TSSAA Hall of Fame during a special luncheon held Monday, April 7, at Middle Tennessee State University in Murfreesboro. The ceremony recognized two administrators, three coaches, two officials, and one contributor for their lasting impact on Tennessee high school athletics. Among them was **Donald Dodgen**, a celebrated coach and athletic director with roots at **Tennessee Wesleyan University** and **McMinn County High School**, Morning Fax whose decades-long career has shaped the lives of count

Donald Dodgen's remarkable 38-year coaching career has left a lasting legacy on high school and college athletics across the state. He began his journey as a standout player at Tennessee Wesleyan, later returning as a coach and earning a spot in the university's Hall of Fame as both an athlete and coach.

His coaching career began at McMinn County High School before continuing at Gatlinburg-Pittman and ultimately Farragut High School, where he built a powerhouse basketball program. Over the years, Dodgen amassed an impressive 655-309 career record, including 308 wins at Farragut and a state tournament appearance in 1982.

In 2010, Dodgen transitioned into the role of Athletic Director at Farragut, where his leadership helped guide the school to 13 state championships across multiple sports. His dedication to excellence and student-athlete development has made him one of the most respected names in Tennessee athletics.

Dodgen joins a distinguished group of eight inductees in the TSSAA Class of 2025, further cementing his place in the state's storied sports history. *Source: TSSAA News*

#### **McMinn County Baseball Recap**



The McMinn County Cherokees earned a 5-2 road victory over the Rhea County Golden Eagles on Monday in a District 5-4A baseball matchup in Evansville.

Rhea County struck first, scoring in the opening inning, but McMinn quickly re-

sponded with a sacrifice fly by Drake Frazier in the second. After briefly falling behind again on a passed ball, the Cherokees took control in the fourth, scoring three runs—highlighted by a two-RBI single from Cooper Wilson and a Rhea error. Kade Hyde added insurance with a solo homer in the sixth.

Sophomore pitcher Marshall Goodner delivered a dominant performance on the mound, going the distance and remaining undefeated. He allowed six hits and no earned runs, striking out nine and walking two. Wilson led the Cherokees with two RBIs, while Jaser Arms and Auston Fugate each had two hits. For Rhea County, Bradley Hall and Corydon Butler collected two hits apiece. The win improves McMinn's record to 11-7, while Rhea County falls to 5-11.
