Search for Missing Teens Near Tennessee River Bridge Paused Due to Weather



Search efforts for two missing teenagers last seen near the Tennessee River Bridge were temporarily paused Thursday morning due to rain and unsafe boating conditions, according to the Loudon County Sheriff's Office. Crews resumed the search

briefly around 8 a.m. but were forced to halt again due to rising safety concerns.

The two teens reportedly jumped off the bridge around 4 a.m. Wednesday following a police pursuit involving a stolen car. The pursuit was eventually called off, and the vehicle was later found abandoned near the bridge on I-75 North. Officers believe the suspects fled on foot before law enforcement arrived.

Shortly after, Loudon County E-911 received reports of vehicle breakins in the nearby Lake Drive community. Deputies responding to the scene detained one teenage suspect who claimed he and two other teens had jumped from the bridge into the river. Multiple agencies continue to work together in the search, which the sheriff's office says remains a top priority. "We remain fully committed to locating the missing teenagers and bringing answers to their families," said Cpl. Cody Bengel.
