- The McMinn County Commissioners will meet in the Blue Room of the McMinn County Courthouse in Athens in Regular Session on Monday, April 21 at 6:00pm.
- The Athens Utilities Board (AUB) will be closed on Friday, April 18, in observance of Good Friday. Regular business operations will resume on Monday, April 21, 2025 at 7:30 a.m. While offices will be closed, AUB crews from all divisions—including Power, Water, Wastewater, and Natural Gas—will remain on standby throughout the Easter weekend to respond to any emergencies and ensure uninterrupted service for the community. Athens City Council to Discuss Liquor License Limit, Property Disposal, and Christmas Light Show at April 15 Meeting



The Athens City Council will hold its regular session TODAY, Tuesday, April 15, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. in the Burkett L. Witt Council Chambers at the Athens Municipal Building.

Highlights of the agenda include a proposal to amend the city code regarding the number of retail liquor store licenses allowed within city limits. Council will consider whether to remove the current limit of two licenses or to increase the limit, with the first reading of one of two proposed ordinances scheduled depending on the decision. Also on the agenda is the approval of a legal settlement, and a resolution to declare property at 2201 Decatur Pike (Lot 1) as surplus, paving the way for its disposal.

Under the consent agenda, council will vote on agreements for a Christmas Lights Show at Athens Regional Park with NoogaLights, LLC, a cemetery maintenance contract with Total Lawn Care, and an agreement with Gresham Smith Engineers for the construction phase of a stormwater project funded by ARP dollars.

Special presentations include recognizing Dr. Trey Ivins of Athens City Middle School, honoring Shelia and the late Dan Chesanow with the VIVID Award, and a Proclamation for Day of Prayer. Additional business includes board appointments and reappointments, and updates from city departments and City Manager Randall Dowling.

The meeting is open to the public and includes time for citizens' comments on agenda items and general issues.

## Family of Drowning Victim Sues GPS Company After Tragic River Incident



The family of Tabitha Smith, who drowned in February 2024 alongside Meigs County Deputy Robert Leonard, has filed a lawsuit against GPS company Garmin. The suit alleges that Garmin's navigation system misled Leonard by displaying a non-

existent bridge over the Tennessee River, causing him to drive into the water while transporting Smith to jail.

Smith, handcuffed in the back of the patrol car following an earlier altercation, drowned in the incident. The family's lawsuit argues the GPS error led to the fatal crash.

Garmin has denied liability, stating the tragedy was due to negligence and has requested the case be dismissed. In addition to the claim against Garmin, Smith's family has also filed a civil lawsuit against Meigs County and Deputy Leonard's estate. *Source: Local 3 News*
