# **McMinn County Education Foundation Honors 77 Youth Leaders**

As part of their recognition, each Youth Leader will be invited back to Tennessee Wesleyan University in late October to experience "A Day in the Life of a College Student," offering them a glimpse into future academic and leadership opportunities.


This exhibit promises to be a moving tribute to the power and resilience of women, making it a must-see for art lovers and community members alike.

# McMinn Cherokees Varsity Baseball Stymied By Walker Valley



McMinn County Varsity Cherokees had trouble keeping up with Walker Valley in a 7-0 loss on Monday.

Walker Valley got on the board in the top of the second inning after McMinn County Varsity Cherokees committed an error, Hayden Harrison stole home, and Owen Sneed singled down the left field line, each scoring one run. Morning Fax

Walker Valley added to their early lead in the top of the third inning after Harrison singled Today's News. This Morning. down the left field line, Cooper Cantrell walked, and Satchel Cole hit a sacrifice fly, each scoring one run.

Marshall Goodner led things off on the hill for McMinn County Varsity Cherokees. The right-handed pitcher gave up five hits and six runs (one earned) over three innings, striking out two and walking two. Titus Torbett stepped on the hill first for Walker Valley. The starting pitcher surrendered six hits and zero runs over seven innings, striking out 11 and walking three.

Chase McDonald led McMinn County Varsity Cherokees with two hits in four at bats. Harrison went 1-for-3 at the plate and led the team with two runs batted in. Torbett led Walker Valley with two hits in three at bats. Walker Valley didn't commit a single error in the field. Jordan Smith had the most chances in the field with 11.

Monroe County Authorities Seize Fentanyl in Early Morning Drug Bust

#### Starr Regional Medical Center Releases 2024 Community Benefit Report



In the early hours of Monday, April 14, 2025, Monroe County Sheriff's Office Detectives, in collaboration with Agents from the 10th Judicial District Drug Task Force, executed a search warrant targeting illegal drug activity in the Madisonville community off Sneed Road.

The operation was part of an ongoing investigation into the illegal sale of Fentanyl, a powerful and potentially deadly synthetic opioid. During the search, law enforcement officers discovered approximately 12.1 grams of suspected Fentanyl, along with multiple other Schedule drugs, drug paraphernalia including digital scales and baggies, and several thousand dollars in cash. One individual was taken into custody and is currently being held at the Monroe County Justice Center. Authorities emphasize that all suspects are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

The Monroe County Sheriff's Office and Narcotics Division reaffirm their commitment to protecting the community and continue working diligently to combat the spread of dangerous drugs throughout the region. Morning Fax *Source: Sheriff Tommy Jones - Facebook*  Starr Regional Medical Center has published its 2024 Community Benefit Report, outlining its continued efforts to support the health and economic vitality of McMinn County.

In 2024, Starr Regional added 102 providers across multiple specialties, including anesthesiology, cardiology, emergency and family medicine, nephrology, OB/GYN, radiology, teleneurology, and telepsychology. The hospital also made over \$9 million in capital improvements, including the purchase of an MRI scanner, CT scanner, da Vinci robotic surgical system, and a Cysto table.

The report notes that Starr Regional provided more than \$49.3 million in health services to those in need, reinforcing its commitment to accessible care for all. It also supported its approximately 655 employees with over \$46.4 million in salaries, wages, and benefits, and invested nearly \$130,000 in professional development and tuition assistance.

Additionally, the hospital contributed \$9.7 million in local and state taxes and maintained support for numerous local organizations, including the American Cancer Society, Athens Area Council for the Arts, Friendly Fellow Club, Good Faith Clinic, and Isaiah 117 House.
