# **TDOT Approves New Downtown Athens Design Overlay**



Great news for downtown Athens! The Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) has officially approved a new design overlay for the city's downtown area as part of its upcoming resurfacing project. This exciting update is based on the community-driven 2020 Downtown Design Master Plan and aims to create a safer, more accessible, and more welcoming environment for all.

Key changes include the removal of the continuous turning lane, new striping and directional arrows to help calm traffic, and additional parking spaces around the courthouse. The design also focuses on improving pedestrian safety and accessibility, with upgraded sidewalks to meet ADA standards.

An aerial graphic of the new design is available, offering a clear look at the improvements planned for the heart of the city.

The 2025 regular season has come to a close for a few teams and is nearing the end for a few others.

#### Here are the latest with Tennessee Wesleyan Athletics:

The **baseball team** has concluded their home schedule, ending the home portion with a 14-5 win against Spartanburg Methodist College on Tuesday. The team holds a 33-10 overall record and will spend the next two weekends on the road for their final two conference series.

The **softball team** holds an 18-9 overall record with seven games remaining in the regular season. Six of the seven are conference games.

The **men's and women's tennis teams** both won the 2025 Appalachian Athletic Conference (AAC) Regular Season Titles with perfect conference records. The men's team went on to win the AAC Tournament Title while the women's team finished as the runners-up. The men's team receives an automatic bid to the NAIA National Tournament.

The **women's lacrosse team** is getting ready to play in the AAC Tournament with a 5-9 overall record.

The **men's and women's track and field teams** are getting set to compete in their conference meet. *The meet is set for Thurs- day-Saturday in Johnson City, TN.* 

TWU recently announced a generous gift from Board of Trustees Chair Dr. Bobby Goodfriend and his wife Wendy to renovate and expand the baseball field at Athens Insurance Stadium. The plans include adding lights to the field, a new video scoreboard, and a renovated press box among other updates. The field will be renamed to Bobby Goodfriend Field and the current name associated with the field, Dr. Jack Bowling, will be placed on a new concourse.
