State Confirms Additional Measles Cases; Total Now at Six

The Tennessee Department of Health (TDH) confirmed two new measles cases on Thursday, bringing the state's total to six. The latest cases were identified in Middle Tennessee, and both individuals are currently recovering at home.

According to TDH, the new cases were linked to previously confirmed infections, and both individuals are cooperating with public health officials by quarantining to prevent further

At this time, the department reports no Morning Fax known additional exposures tied to the new cases and no evidence of sustained

community transmission in Tennessee. This update comes amid an ongoing national measles outbreak affecting more than 700 people across 25 states, with two confirmed deaths reported in the U.S.

Health officials continue to monitor the situation and encourage vaccination and public awareness to help prevent further spread of the disease.

McMinn Cherokees Edge Walker Valley 3-2 in Thursday Pitchers' Duel

McMinn County Varsity Cherokees edged past Walker Valley 3 -2 on Thursday in a tightly contested game highlighted by strong pitching performances from both teams.

Bo Barnett took the mound for the Cherokees and recorded 17 outs over five and two-thirds innings. He allowed just three hits and one run while striking out five and walking four. Luke Lawson came in as relief to help seal the win.

Walker Valley struck first in the top of the first inning when Jordan Smith singled to score a run. But McMinn County responded in the bottom of the third with three runs. Lawson started the rally with an infield single, followed by an RBI walk from Auston Fugate and an RBI single from Drake Frazier down the left field line.

Frazier and Fugate each drove in a run, while Frazier and Lawson led the offense with two hits apiece. Smith and Titus Torbett each collected an RBI for Walker Valley, which turned a double play on defense.

Despite a solid outing from Smith on the mound for Walker Valley—allowing five hits and three runs (two earned) over two innings—McMinn County's timely hits and strong pitching made the difference.

Friday Game 1: MCHS Varsity Cherokees Drop 12-8 Battle to McCallie After Early Deficit

The McMinn County Varsity Cherokees fell 12-8 to the McCallie Varsity Blue Tornado on Friday after a tough start in the opening innings.

McCallie surged ahead with five runs in the first inning, fueled by a Jerome Lehoux RBI single, a two-run error, and RBI hits from Cooper Prichard and Hamilton Downs. They continued to build their lead with two more runs in the second on RBI walks and a two-run homer from Lehoux in the third.

Despite the early gap, McMinn County stayed in the game behind a solid offensive showing. Drake Frazier went 3-for-3 at the plate, while Luke Lawson drove in two runs with a 2-for-4 performance. Chase McDonald also added two hits.

On the mound, JP Brannen allowed five runs (one earned) in the first inning, and Matthew Woods pitched three innings in relief, giving up three runs on five hits.

McCallie tallied 16 hits overall, with Lehoux leading the offense and Tyler Shortridge stealing two of the team's six total bases. The Blue Tornado also turned two double plays in a strong allaround effort.

Frazier provided pop in the middle of the lineup, and led McMinn County Varsity Cherokees with two runs batted in. The right-handed hitter went 2-for-3 on the day.
