

The Athens Historic Preservation Commission (AHPC) is considering the creation of a historic district in the downtown area and will host an informational public meeting on May 1 at 5:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

The purpose of the meeting is to discuss the potential district and receive input from downtown

property owners.

Three Bears Euthanized After Woman Dragged from Porch in Sevier County



Three black bears were lethally removed by the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA) after a woman was bitten and dragged from her porch in Sevier County on Thursday, April 17.

The TWRA responded around 7:40 p.m. and found a yearling bear inside a trap set following a prior incident where a bear broke into a vehicle to steal groceries. The vehicle was destroyed. Wildlife officers also encountered an adult female bear and another yearling nearby.

Due to the bears' food-conditioning, habituation to humans, and increasingly bold behavior—including vehicle breakins and this latest human encounter—all three bears were euthanized as a public safety measure. Although emergency responders found no serious injuries on the woman involved, TWRA emphasized the significant danger these bears posed.

"These decisions are never made lightly," the agency stated. "Our priority is always the safety of both people and wild-life."

TWRA advises residents in bear-prone areas to follow BearWise safety tips, including removing bird feeders during active bear seasons, securing trash, and never feeding bears.
