Blaze Destroys Shed, Camper, and Trailer in Englewood

McMinn County Varsity Cherokees Walk It Off Versus Polk County Varsity Wildcats



It came down to the wire on Saturday, as McMinn County Varsity Cherokees grabbed the victory in walk-off fashion, 7-6, over Polk County Varsity Wildcats. The game was tied at six in the bottom of the seventh when Marshall Goodner hit a solo home run to left field.

McMinn County Varsity Cherokees built a 4-run lead in the fifth inning and then held off Polk County Varsity Wildcats's charge. Polk County Varsity Wildcats closed the gap by scoring on a walk and a grand slam.

A walk by Linc Brazzell put McMinn County Varsity Cherokees on the board in the

bottom of the second.

Zanten Branham homered to left field, which helped Polk County Varsity Wildcats tie the game at one in the top of the fifth.

McMinn County Varsity Cherokees captured the lead, 5-1, in the bottom of the fifth after Brazzell homered to left field, Chase McDonald tripled to right field, Drake Frazier singled down the left field line, and Jack Goodin singled down the left field line, each scoring one run.

Polk County Varsity Wildcats flipped the game on its head in the top of the sixth, scoring five runs on one hit to take the lead, 6-5. The biggest blow in the inning was a grand slam to left field by Branham that drove in four.

McDonald hit a sacrifice fly, which helped McMinn County Varsity Cherokees tie the game at six in the bottom of the sixth.

Goodner led things off on the mound for McMinn County Varsity Cherokees. The right-handed pitcher gave up one hit and zero runs over three innings, striking out five and walking two. Tanner Silvers led things off on the mound for Polk County Varsity Wildcats. The pitcher surrendered one hit and one run (zero earned) over two innings, striking out two and walking two. JP Brannen tossed one inning of zero-run ball for McMinn County Varsity Cherokees in relief. The hurler surrendered one hit, striking out three and walking one.

McMinn County Varsity Cherokees amassed nine hits in the game. Goodin, Frazier, and Goodner each collected two hits for McMinn County Varsity Cherokees. McDonald and Brazzell each drove in two runs for McMinn County Varsity Cherokees. Frazier and Luke Lawson each stole multiple bases for McMinn County Varsity Cherokees ran wild on the base paths, amassing five stolen bases for the game.

Branham went 2-for-4 at the plate and led the team with five runs batted in. Branham and Silvers each collected two hits for Polk County Varsity Wildcats. The McMinn County Varsity Cherokees play at home on Monday against East Hamilton in their next game.
