Autopsy confirms drowning deaths of Chattanooga teens after bridge jump in Loudon County



Autopsy reports released by the Knox County Regional Forensic Center confirm that two Chattanooga teenagers who jumped from a bridge during a police chase in April died from accidental drowning in the Tennessee River.

The victims were identified as 18-year-old MaRico Johnson and 16-yearold Mykel Haddox. Both teens fell approximately 100 Morning Fax feet from the I-75 bridge near mile marker 74 in Loudon County and were later found underwater during a multi-day search. Toxicology results showed the presence of THC, the active ingredient in marijuana, in both teens' systems.

The incident occurred early on the morning of April 9, when a stolen vehicle being pursued by law enforcement from multiple counties ran out of gas and stopped on the interstate bridge. Three teens exited the vehicle and jumped over a barrier, reportedly believing it would lead them to the opposite side of the highway. Instead, they fell into a gap between the bridge spans and into the river below.

One of the teens survived and managed to swim to shore, later being found with injuries including a punctured lung. He was taken to Fort Loudoun Medical Center, where he informed authorities of the other two individuals. Search teams recovered the 16-year-old's body on April 11 and the 18-year-old's body on April 13.

The incident is still under investigation by local authorities. Source: WBIR

Gov. Bill Lee Signs Farmland Preservation Act to Protect Tennessee Agriculture



Governor Bill Lee has signed the **Farmland Preservation Act** into law, establishing a landmark program aimed at protecting Tennessee's rapidly disappearing farmland for future generations.

The legislation, which passed with broad bipartisan support, creates a **permanent conservation easement** program and a **grant fund** to support farmers who voluntarily choose to preserve their land. The initiative is designed to combat the alarming loss of agricultural and forest lands—estimated at **240 acres per day** statewide.

"Agriculture is the top driver of Tennessee's economy," said Gov. Lee. "The Farmland Preservation Act ensures that family farms can be preserved well into the future."

The act was praised by officials across state government and agriculture, including **Agriculture Commissioner Charlie Hatcher**, who called the legislation a vital step in maintaining Tennessee's rural identity and food security. Lawmakers such as **Senate Majority Leader Jack Johnson** and **Representative Greg Vital**, who helped sponsor the bill, high-lighted the program's long-term benefits for both the economy and quality of life in Tennessee.

Tennessee Farm Bureau President Eric Mayberry applauded the passage of the bill, calling it a meaningful investment in protecting the state's most important industry.
