House Narrowly Passes 'One Big Beautiful Bill' amid Deep Cuts; Bill heads to Senate, Fleischmann releases Statement



In a razor-thin 215–214 vote, the U.S. House of Representatives has passed H.R. 1, the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act," a sweeping Republican spending and tax proposal that now faces a tough path through the Senate. The bill delivers on several key promises from former President Donald Trump's "America First" agenda, including major tax cuts, reductions in social safety net programs, and new incentives for American energy production.

Among its most controversial provisions is a proposed **\$880 billion cut to Medicaid over the next decade**, which analysts say could result in over **10**

million people losing coverage by 2034. The bill also imposes work requirements on certain Medicaid recipients, penalizes states for covering undocumented immigrants, and eliminates state funding mechanisms long used to support the program. These changes are expected to hit rural hospitals, long-term care facilities, and low-income families the hardest.

Additional provisions include a **permanent extension of the 2017 Trump tax cuts**, an expansion of the **Child Tax Credit**, and the elimination of federal income tax on **overtime pay and tips**. While supporters argue these measures will boost economic growth, the bill is not revenue-neutral. It is projected to **increase the federal deficit by \$4 to \$6 trillion** over the next decade.

The measure has created deep divisions not only between parties but within the Republican caucus itself. Rep. Lloyd Smucker (PA) warned, "*The reconciliation bill must not add to the deficit*," and Rep. Chip Roy (TX) declared, "*This bill falls profoundly short. I am a 'no' on this bill unless serious reforms are made.*"

Valor Guild to Host Juneteenth Celebration in Athens on June 21






Local Groups to Honor Veterans with **Memorial Day Grave Marking Ceremonies**

House Narrowly Passes 'One Big Beautiful Bill' amid Deep Cuts; Bill heads to Senate, Fleischmann releases Statement (Continued)

Despite internal GOP tensions and Democratic opposition, the bill passed the House Budget Committee by a 17–16 vote on May 18, before clearing the full House early on May 22. It now awaits further review and debate in the Senate, where changes are expected and passage is far from guaranteed.

Speaker Mike Johnson has expressed hope for final passage by Memorial Day, though Senate leaders say the process could extend into the fall. A major deadline looms: October 1, the start of the federal fiscal year, which could trigger a government shutdown if no budget is approved.

At the center of the bill's energy and infrastructure priorities is **Tennessee Congressman Chuck Fleischmann**, who chairs the House Energy and Water Appropriations Subcommittee. Fleischmann strongly supported the bill, calling it a historic achievement.



"Today, I proudly voted YES on House Republicans' One Big Beau-CHUCKFLEISCHMANN tiful Bill Act that delivers President Trump's America First Agenda," said Fleischmann. "This historic bill permanently slashes taxes for hardworking East Tennesseans, invests in border security,

puts our country back on a path toward fiscal sanity, strengthens the benefits Americans have paid for, builds up American military might to restore peace through strength, and unleashes American-made energy dominance."

He added, "As Chairman of Energy and Water Appropriations, I am particularly pleased with the continued support for advanced nuclear reactors... which underscores President Trump's continuing commitment to work with me to create America's New Nuclear Future."
