Meigs County Teen Charged with First-Degree Murder in Georgetown Shooting



A 15-year-old Meigs County girl is facing a charge of first-degree murder following the shooting death of a man early Tuesday morning in the Georgetown area.

District Attorney General Russell Johnson confirmed that a juvenile delinquent petition has been filed against the teen in connection with the fatal shooting of 35-year-old Richard High. High was killed by a single gunshot wound at a resi-

dence on Gunstocker Road during the early morning hours of June 10.

The name of the juvenile has not been released due to her age. A detention hearing was held Thursday, June 12, in Meigs County Juvenile Court.

General Johnson stated the case will proceed in juvenile court for now. No decision has been made regarding whether the case will be transferred to adult court. "As in these types of cases, we expect that there will be court-ordered evaluations of the juvenile given the seriousness and nature of the crime and the age of the juvenile," he said.

The incident occurred at 245 Gunstocker Road. The property owner told authorities he rents one unit of the duplex to a father and two children and was unaware of any issues until law enforcement arrived around 5:00 a.m. Tuesday.

The Meigs County Sheriff's Office and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation are continuing the homicide investigation. No additional details have been released. *Source: Local 3 News*

Driver Hospitalized After Crashing Across Highway 411 Median



A single-vehicle crash on Tuesday afternoon sent one person to the hospital after a 2017 Hyundai Sonata left a business and crossed two lanes of Highway 411 before coming to a stop in the median.

The incident occurred around 12:30 p.m. at the intersection of Highway 411 and County Road 532 in Etowah. Authorities believe the driver may have suffered a medical episode that led to the crash.

Emergency crews from Etowah Rural Fire, Etowah City Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Department responded to the scene. The driver was transported by AMR to Sweetwater Hospital for treatment. Etowah Rural Firefighter Chris Jones was in command of the scene. The accident is being investigated by THP Trooper Andrew Metelits.

Two Injured in Fire Explosion in McDonald



Two people were seriously injured Wednesday night in McDonald, Tennessee, after an explosion occurred while they were using an accelerant to start a fire. According to Bradley County EMS and Fire Chief Jeff Stewart, the blast caused severe burns to both individuals.

One of the victims was airlifted to the burn center at Vanderbilt University Medical Center in serious condition, while the second was transported by ground to Erlanger Hospital in Chattanooga.

Authorities have not released the names of the man and woman involved. The incident remains under investigation.

Peoples Bank Expands Financial Education Efforts Across East Tennessee




