The Doctor with 'Gifted Hands' visits Athens



It was a sell-out crowd Saturday night when famed pediatric neurosurgeon Dr. Ben Carson spoke to a large crowd at McMinn County High School. Carson was the former director of pediatric neurosurgery at Johns Hopkins Children's Center. At the age of 33, he became the youngest to head the specialty in the U.S. He gained world wide fame after organizing a team of surgeons in the first-known separation of conjoined twins who were joined at the head. Carson gave a moving description of his life; growing up in poverty in inner city Detroit and being inspired by his mother and the book of Proverbs to obtain wisdom and knowledge. Cleveland State Included in Major Statewide Building Plan Approved by TBR

tal investment, following action taken by the Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR) during its quarterly meeting Friday at Northeast State Community College.

Among the \$449 million in proposed building projects approved by the board is a \$92 million plan to replace and renovate Cleveland State's Career Education Center. The project is part of the board's Fiscal Year 2026-27 capital request, which now goes to the Tennessee Higher Education Commission for further consideration before potentially being included in the governor's state budget proposal next year.

Cleveland State's project is the largest single investment among the eight community college projects approved by the board, underscoring the institution's role in workforce development and technical education for the region.

The proposed renovations are part of the TBR's renewed focus on community college infrastructure after recent years saw over \$1.5 billion directed toward Tennessee Colleges of Applied Technology (TCATs).

In addition to capital projects, the board approved a new system-wide policy on artificial intelligence use, adopted revised policies impacting student organizations and learning support, and reviewed dual enrollment growth — with more than 38,000 high school students now earning college credit at TBR institutions.

The board also approved the system's preliminary \$1.5 billion budget for FY 2025-26 and recognized 173 community college faculty members for promotion. More information on the board meeting and materials is available at: tbr.edu/board/june-2025-quarterly-board-meeting.
