

# Athens Bar Owner Fatally Shot; Suspect Arrested After Overnight Pursuit



A 24-year-old man has been arrested in connection with the fatal shooting of a local bar owner early Saturday morning, authorities say. According to McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy, the incident occurred just after midnight at the Double C Bar on Highway 30 west of Athens. The suspect, identified as William Charles Thomas Sullivan of Athens, reportedly had been involved in an earlier altercation at the bar involving a knife.

"Based on witness statements, Mr. Sullivan had been asked to leave the bar by staff after making threats with a knife, though those threats were not reported to 911 at the time," Sheriff Guy said. "Later, the suspect fired shots at other patrons in the parking lot. When confronted by the bar owner, Randy Croft, Mr. Sullivan appears to have fatally shot him before taking Mr. Croft's truck and fleeing the scene."

Authorities launched a pursuit that crossed into Meigs County, where Sullivan was apprehended. He is currently being held at the McMinn County Jail on a murder charge, with additional charges pending as the investigation continues. Sheriff Guy praised the cooperation of multiple agencies in quickly apprehending the suspect. "Our thoughts are with Mr. Croft's family at this time," he said.

Residents and business owners across from the bar reported hearing gunfire and police sirens during the incident. One local resident

left flowers at the bar's front door, remembering the owner and the chaotic events of early Saturday.

The investigation involved the McMinn County Sheriff's Office, Athens Police Department, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, and Meigs County Sheriff's Office.

#### Fire Reported at Etowah Construction Site



Etowah City Fire Department responded early Friday morning to a fire at a new home under construction at the corner of Ohio Avenue and Second Street.

Fire crews arrived around 6:30 a.m. to find smoke coming from the crawl space beneath the house. Etowah Rural Fire Department was called in for mutual aid.

A passerby who noticed two glows under the house attempted to extinguish the flames and sustained a minor burn to the hand. AMR evaluated the injury, but no transport was required.

Utilities were shut off by EUB, and Etowah City Police assisted on the scene. The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation's Arson & Bomb Division was called to investigate. Etowah City Fire Chief Adam Hafley was in command.

## **Tennessee Opens Ocoee River State Park**



Tennessee State Parks officially dedicated the new Ocoee River State Park on September 20, separating it from the former Hiwassee/Ocoee Scenic River State Park. The standalone park aims to better protect natural

resources, expand services, and serve the community and visitors, offering more than 17 miles of river for paddlers of all skill levels—from whitewater rapids to calm stretches for beginners.

Governor Bill Lee noted the park's unique value and said it brings Tennessee's total number of state parks to 61, with 14 new parks created under his administration—a state record. The opening included a morning dedication ceremony and a public celebration featuring live music, storytelling, and food vendors, organized in partnership with the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, the Polk County Chamber of Commerce, Four Rivers Events, the Tennessee Valley Authority, and the U.S. Forest Service. *Source: Chattanoogan.com*

# Vols Roll Past UAB, 56-24, as Heupel Earns 40th Win



No. 15 Tennessee jumped out early and never looked back Saturday afternoon, hammering UAB 56-24 before a sellout crowd of 101,915 at Neyland Stadium.

Quarterback Joey Aguilar set the tone with three touchdown passes, while running backs DeSean Bishop, Peyton Lewis and Star Thomas all found the end zone in a balanced attack that piled up 510 total yards. The Vols (3-1, 0-1 SEC) scored touchdowns on six of their first seven possessions and led 42 -7 at halftime.

Bishop rushed for two scores, Lewis added 81 yards and a touchdown, and Thomas tallied both a rushing and receiving touchdown. Wide-outs Chris Brazzell II and Mike Matthews each hauled in early TD strikes as Aguilar

finished 15-of-22 for 218 yards.

Defensively, Tennessee smothered UAB's run game, holding the Blazers (2-2, 0-1 AAC) to just 23 rushing yards. Sophomore defensive back Boo Carter led the way with a career-high nine tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack, and two forced fumbles. Kaleb Beasley returned one of those fumbles 23 yards for a touchdown.

The win marked head coach Josh Heupel's 40th at Tennessee, making him just the seventh Vol coach to reach that milestone and the first since Phillip Fulmer. Under Heupel, Tennessee has now won 17 straight regular-season non-conference games.

The Vols remained No. 15 in both national polls and now turn their attention to their first road test of the season next Saturday at Mississippi State. Kickoff is set for 4:15 p.m. ET on SEC Network. *Source: UTSports.com*


