

Three Injured in Madisonville Crash



Three people were injured Monday evening in a two-vehicle crash at the intersection of Highway 68 and Englewood Road.

The accident, which occurred around 5:30 p.m., involved a 2024 Ford Bronco

and a 2020 Dodge Ram. The driver and passenger of the Bronco, along with a passenger in the Ram, were treated at the scene by Monroe County EMS before being transported to Sweetwater Hospital.

Responding agencies included Madisonville City Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, and Englewood Rural Fire. Madisonville Police Sgt. Kyle Day is investigating the accident. Madisonville City Fire Chief Mike Smallen was in command of the scene.

Multiple Agencies Respond to House Fire



A fire broke out Monday around 2:30 p.m. in the 200 block of Creek Road, prompting a large mutual aid response from area fire departments.

The Christiansburg Fire Department requested assistance from Englewood, Madisonville, Tellico Plains, Notchey Creek, Niota, Hopewell, Mount Vernon, and Gudger fire departments. Monroe County EMS, the Monroe County Sheriff's Department, and Sweetwater Utilities were also on standby.

Incident command was led by Todd Torbett. The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

Arts Center awarded National Grant

Athens Area Council for the Arts + The Arts Center announced recently that it was awarded a 2025 Civic Hub grant from the Trust for Civic Life, a national grant maker supporting rural communities. This funding will support the group's work in bringing the people of Athens and McMinn County together in new and meaningful ways.

Through its Civic Hubs grants program, the Trust for Civic Life invests \$8 million annually into locally-led groups across rural America that strengthen civic engagement and create opportunities for long-term community collaboration. These grants support a wide range of efforts like local events, public spaces, new programs, and communitywide initiatives – all designed to bring neighbors together to solve challenges and build stronger connections.

The Trust's grants program aims to reach and fund groups working on the ground that are difficult for national philanthropy to find and fund. The latest round of funding awarded \$8 million in grants ranging from \$150K to \$500K each, with new grantees together serving 382 rural counties across the country.
