Multiple Street Closures Announced in Athens for Upcoming Events




The City of Athens Public Works Department has announced several upcoming street closures to accommodate community events.

College Street, from Jackson Street to Long Street, will be closed twice in the coming weeks. The first closure will take place Thursday, Sept. 25, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. for Tennessee Wesleyan University's Seesawathon event and Mimi & Papa's Food Truck. The second closure will follow on Thursday, Oct. 2, from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. for Tennessee Wesleyan's Choose Blue Open House.

A larger set of closures is scheduled for the Pumpkintown Festival. From 4 p.m. Friday, Oct. 10, until 7 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 11, the following streets will be closed: Madison Avenue from Hill to Green; Washington Avenue from Church to Green; Hornsby Street from Church to Green; White Street from College to Bank; North Jackson Street from College to Highway 30; Long Street from Washington to Madison; and Baxter Street from Washington to Highway 30.

Vols Head to Starkville for First Road Test of Season

No. 15 Tennessee will face its first road challenge of the 2025 **Game Information** season when it travels to Starkville to take on Mississippi State this Saturday. Kickoff is set for 4:15 p.m. Eastern at Davis Wade Stadium, with the game airing on SEC Network.

The matchup comes against an undefeated Bulldogs team that is off to its first 4-0 start since 2014. Mississippi State boasts one of the league's most productive offenses, averaging nearly 40 points per game behind veteran quarterback Blake Shapen. Tennessee's defense, which showed progress last week, will be tested by the Bulldogs' ability to generate both explosive passing plays and strong rushing production.

Offensively, the Vols will look to continue their early-season success against a Mississippi State defense that has improved significantly from a year ago. Depth and upgraded personnel have made the Bulldogs a more balanced and consistent opponent across all three phases of the game.

Oddsmakers list Tennessee as a 7.5-point favorite, with the over/under set at 63.5 total points.
