Tuesday Morning Weather Update: Mountain Snowstorm Continues Across Southern Appalachians



A powerful early-season snowstorm continues across the Southern Appalachians this Tuesday morning, with steady snow falling above 3,000 feet and light accumulations reported on the Cumberland Plateau.


Winter Weather Advisories have been expanded around the Plateau and into northeast Tennessee, while a Winter Storm Warning remains in effect for the Great Smoky Mountains. Wind gusts up to 40 mph are accompanying the snow, leading to low visibility for TVA crews and other employees during shift changes. Spotty to scattered power outages are possible for local power companies, though major TVA transmission impacts are not expected. Snow will continue through the day and into the evening, with periods of heavy and blowing snow in the higher elevations. Some areas may see a brief lull around midday before snow showers redevelop this afternoon.

- 5,000 feet and higher: 10–15 inches of snow expected
- **Above 3.000 feet:** 4–8 inches likely
- 1,500–3,000 feet: 1–4 inches possible in East Tennessee and southwest Virginia foothills
- Cumberland Plateau: 1–2 inches expected
- Lower elevations (including Knoxville): light dusting possible

Temperatures remain well below normal. Highs today will only reach the upper 30s, about 25 degrees colder than average, with widespread sub-freezing temperatures tonight. Lows will drop into the mid-20s, and wind chills will dip into the teens, creating dangerous conditions for outdoor workers. A hard freeze and widespread frost are expected overnight into early Wednesday morning.

Living Heritage Museum Awarded Grant to Digitize Historical Archives



The McMinn County Living Heritage Museum has received a \$6,660 Tennessee America 250 Project Support Grant from the Tennessee Commission for the United States Semiquincentennial, administered by the Tennessee State Museum.

The funding will allow the museum to digitize and catalog more than 2,000 historical documents and images, making them freely available online for research, education, and public access. The grant will also fund the purchase of an overhead projector and 100-inch screen to help classrooms and community groups engage with the digital archives in an interactive, educational setting.

"This grant preserves McMinn County's role in America's democratic story and makes it accessible to all," said Museum Director Brett King. "It advances our mission to safeguard and share our heritage for generations."

The Tennessee America 250 Project Support Grant is part of a statewide initiative celebrating the nation's 250th anniversary in 2026. From the \$6.435 million allocated to the Tennessee State Museum, the first round of the competitive program drew 220 applications totaling nearly \$4 million. Eighty grants were awarded across 37 counties, totaling \$1.57 million.

"I'm inspired by statewide excitement for the nation's 250th anniversary," said Ashley Howell, Tennessee State Museum Executive Director and Commission Chair. "These projects will spark engagement through exhibitions, programs, and preservation in 2026."

First-round projects must be completed by April 30, 2027. A full list of recipients is available at www.tn250.com.
