The Friendly Fellow Club will once again hold its long-running Christmas Food Basket Drive this December, continuing nearly 90 years of service to Athens and McMinn County families in need.

Applications for assistance are available now at the drive-through windows of local banks and credit unions, including Old National, Simmons, Truist, Peoples Bank, SouthEast Bank, Citizens National, Regions, TVFCU, ORNL FCU, and Bowater Credit Union. Completed applications must be returned or postmarked by Sunday, November 30, 2025, to P.O. Box 325, Athens, TN 37371-0325. Applicants must live in McMinn County.

Food boxes will be packed Monday, December 22 at 6 p.m. and distributed Tuesday, December 23 from 8:30–11 a.m. at the National Guard Armory on Highway 30 between Athens and Etowah. The all-volunteer 501(c)(3) organization ensures 100% of donations go directly to help local families. Contributions can be made online at friendlyfellows.org, mailed to P.O. Box 325, or dropped off at The Daily Post-Athenian office on South White Street in the Whiteway Shopping Center. Donations in honor or memory of loved ones are welcome. 
