Former MCHS Standout Ronnie McMahan Named to Vanderbilt Athletics Hall of Fame



Ronnie McMahan, a standout basketball player for Vanderbilt University and former star at Athens Jr. High and McMinn County High School, has been named to the Vanderbilt Athletics Hall of Fame's Class of 2025.

McMahan, a native of Middle Tennessee, enjoyed a remarkable collegiate career with the Commodores from the early 1990s, leaving a lasting mark on the program. A starter in 114 of 124 career games, he finished his Vanderbilt tenure with 1,719 points, ranking fifth in program history at the time. He also excelled from long range, ranking third all-time in career three-pointers, and seventh in career steals.

He played a key supporting role during the 1993 Sweet 16 run alongside leading scorer Billy McCaffrey and later emerged as a leading scorer himself, averaging 18.3 points per game as a senior. McMahan's ability to shine in high-pressure games helped set a standard for future Vanderbilt players.

After his collegiate career, McMahan remained a fixture in local basketball, serving as Associate Dean of 9th and 10th grade at Montgomery Bell Academy while coaching both basketball and football. His dedication to his community and the game reflects the same drive and excellence that defined his playing days.

The Vanderbilt Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2025, representing seven sports and spanning more than a century of Commodore history, will be formally inducted at the Student Life Center on Feb. 20, 2026.

Cleveland State, TCAT Athens Sign Agreement to Expand Student Pathways

Cleveland State Community College and the Tennessee College of Applied Technology (TCAT) Athens have entered into a new articulation agreement designed to give students a clear and seamless pathway from technical training to college completion.

The agreement allows students to begin their education at TCAT Athens and continue their studies at Cleveland State Community College in three high-demand programs: Computer Information Technology Cyber Defense, Computer Information Technology Cloud Computing, and Medical Office Administrative Professional Technology.

College officials said the partnership aligns coursework between the two institutions, helping students build practical, career-ready skills in areas such as cybersecurity, cloud computing, technical systems, software, and medical office administration. These programs are designed to prepare graduates for in-demand careers in today's workforce.

Leaders from both institutions emphasized that the agreement expands educational opportunities while strengthening the region's workforce. The collaboration is among the first of its kind in Tennessee between a TCAT and a community college. Both schools operate under the Tennessee Board of Regents.

Investigation Underway Following Inmate Death at Monroe County Jail

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation is looking into the death of a Monroe County Jail inmate that occurred early Tuesday morning.

Michael Wayne Harris, 46, of Madisonville, was serving an 18-year sentence after being convicted in June 2025 of possession of Schedule II methamphetamine for resale.

Authorities report that during a routine bed check at 6:16 a.m., correctional officers observed no issues in Harris' cell. Minutes later, another inmate noticed something unusual and alerted staff. Officers found Harris had attempted to take his own life using a bedsheet. Jail personnel immediately intervened, performing CPR before transporting him to Sweetwater Hospital, where he was later pronounced deceased. The District Attorney's Office was notified, and the TBI has been called to conduct an independent investigation, which is standard procedure for any in-custody death. Driver Suffers Medical Emergency, Overturns Truck on Co. Rd. 784 in Etowah



A driver was hospitalized Tuesday afternoon after a medical emergency caused them to lose consciousness and overturn their truck on County Road 784.

The incident occurred around 4:30 p.m. involving a 2018 Ford F-150. Emergency responders extricated the driver from the vehicle before transporting them via AMR ambulance to Starr Regional Etowah for treatment.

Etowah Rural Fire, Claxton Fire, and Etowah City Fire all responded to the scene, with Capt. Ryland Hearn of Etowah Rural Fire overseeing operations. Tennessee Highway Patrol Trooper Andrew Metelits conducted the accident investigation.




