The Athens Area Council for the Arts will wrap up its 2025–26 House Blend Concert Series with *Evening with the Stars* on **Friday, May 8 at 7 p.m. at The Arts Center.**

Directed by Andrew Kimball, the annual showcase highlights regional talent of all kinds, including singing,

dancing, and acting. Auditions will be held Thursday, April 30 at 6 p.m. at The Arts Center, with participants asked to come prepared to perform. A pianist will be available for accompaniment, and the AACA house band September Song will assist during rehearsal and the show.

Organizers say the event continues a long-standing tradition of showcasing local performers, including past participants who have gone on to broader recognition. The performance will take place in the Sue E. Trotter Black Box Theater, with ticket prices ranging from \$15 to \$40 depending on the event.

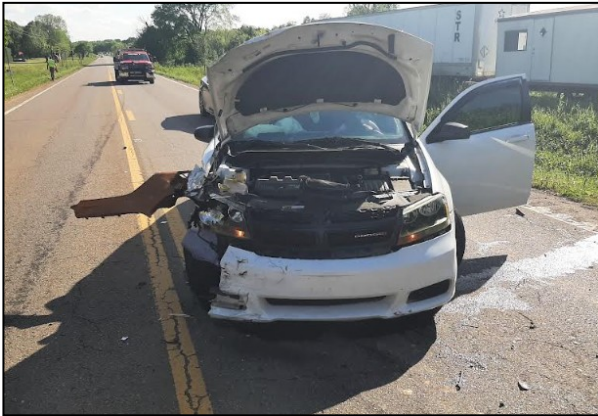

No Injuries Reported in Niota Crash Involving Child Passenger



No injuries were reported following a two-vehicle crash Monday afternoon at the intersection of Highway 11 and County Road 323 in Niota.

Authorities said a white Dodge and a bronze Chevrolet Equinox collided around 5 p.m. An 8-year-old passenger in the Equinox was evaluated at the scene by EMS and first responders. All occupants were wearing seatbelts and did not suffer injuries.

Responding agencies included the Niota and North McMinn fire departments, AMR, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Office.

The crash is under investigation by Tennessee Highway Patrol Trooper Dean Conk Jr..

UT Extension-McMinn Announces May Programs and Upcoming Classes



The UT Extension-McMinn has released a full schedule of upcoming programs and classes for May, along with additional opportunities planned for June and July, offering a variety of educational and wellness activities for the community.

Kicking off the May schedule is the **Grandparent Club**, which will meet *May 6 at 1 p.m.* at the UT Extension-McMinn Office, located at 2345 Denso Drive. The free session will feature an Iris Paper Folding Card Workshop led by instructor Cindy Mishtal. The monthly program is designed to provide a space for grandparents to connect, share experiences, and learn new skills while building a supportive community. Organizers describe the group as an opportunity to stimulate the mind, strengthen relationships, and help participants "love, lead, and leave a healthy legacy for the next generation." The club meets the first Wednesday of each month.

Later in the month, UT Extension will offer "**RELAX: Alternatives to Anger**," a four-part class series scheduled for *May 12, 14, 19, and 21 from 10 a.m. to noon* at the same location. The course, which costs \$40, focuses on increasing awareness of the impact of anger on social-emotional health and interpersonal relationships while providing practical strategies for managing heightened emotions. The RELAX model emphasizes techniques to recognize, empathize, listen, accept, and "x-out" the past, helping participants develop in-the-moment de-escalation skills.

In addition to classes, UT Extension is offering **free pressure canner gauge testing**. Residents can call to make an appointment or drop off their gauge at the office. Officials note that annual testing is critical, as gauges can lose accuracy over time due to wear, storage, or handling. An inaccurate gauge can lead to under-processing, which may leave harmful pathogens such as *Clostridium botulinum* in low-acid foods, or over-processing, which can reduce food quality.

Looking ahead, several classes are scheduled for early summer. From *June 9 through June 25*, **Tai Chi for Diabetes** will be offered from *10 to 11 a.m. for a fee of \$48*, followed by WITS Brain Exercise from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., which is free to participants. Canning College workshops will also be held, including a **water-bath canning class on June 18 from 6 to 8 p.m.** and a **pressure canning class on July 14 from 6 to 8 p.m., each costing \$25.**
